

# A Permanent Reminder

Each brick is inscribed with the name of a present or past boy and the year in which he joined the School. These special paving bricks are individually created with each boy's name deeply etched into the upper surface. A special black resin is used for the lettering, which is guaranteed to last the lifetime of the brick.

**These commemorative bricks cost £100 each and the money raised from their sale is used to the benefit of all boys and helps to add to the existing resources at Arnold House.**

Funds raised from their sale have so far been used to improve facilities and equipment for IT, music, science, sport and the library.

# A Lasting Legacy

To mark the centenary of Arnold House in 2005, a Centenary Path of commemorative bricks was created in the front courtyard. In 2006, following a competition among current boys, the project was renamed Hanson's Heroes, after Miss Amy Hanson who founded the school in 1916. During these early days, Miss Hanson would borrow a carriage from a well-known St John's Wood doctor, so that she could be seen driving around the neighbourhood in order to bring herself to the notice of prospective parents. She remained as Headmistress until 1939 when she was succeeded by George Smart.
