Thank you for your interest in the role of Head of Religious Studies/Humanities Teacher at Arnold House.

The School was founded in 1905 in St John's Wood. It is an independent preparatory school for boys from 3 to 13, and a member of IAPS (the Independent Association of Preparatory Schools). In 2021 we opened a Pre-Prep department a short walk away at Marlborough Place. We now have 370 boys on roll across 10 year groups. Each year group is split into two forms.

A thriving school, Arnold House aims to provide an education of breadth and

excellence and to serve the boys' best interests across the ability range. We aim to do so in a supportive, purposeful and stimulating environment, to provide a foundation for the boys' development within a generous Christian ethos, to help them mature into well-rounded individuals by developing their enjoyment of music, the arts and sport, and to promote good citizenship through the virtues of courtesy and industry. The cultural identity of the school is diverse and enriched with an array of backgrounds being represented throughout.

The School values a supportive family ethos and operates in a relaxed, though

structured manner, ensuring that all boys are cherished and achievements recognised and rewarded. Academically, sights are set high with the object being for each boy to develop his talents.

As a registered charitable trust, Arnold House is overseen and supported by an experienced Governing Body.

Arnold House underwent an Educational Quality Inspection in November 2022, in which it was reported that both the quality of pupils' academic and other achievements and the quality of pupils' personal development is excellent.

THE RELIGIOUS STUDIES AND HISTORY DEPARTMENTS AND THE ROLE

The Religious Studies & History Departments

In RS boys are introduced to the key ideas and values that permeate the religions and philosophies of the world, they are encouraged to understand areas of common ethical values among the different world religions and philosophies and consider how religious beliefs impact on the lives of people in Britain and across the world. Skills are developed for reasoning, understanding and debate.

The History department seeks primarily to develop a love of the subject and to encourage boys' curiosity about the past and how others lived when compared to today. Boys are encouraged to develop an appreciation of their own and others' inheritance, to absorb and recount the narrative of history while being aware that people recount history from different perspectives. In addition boys develop other historical skills such as chronology, empathy, interpretation, comparison and investigation - skills that are very adaptable to life beyond school.

In Geography, boys develop an understanding of landforms and the processes that shape the physical environment, understand how humans interact with the physical environment and their impact upon it and develop Geographical skills such as extrapolating data, identifying connections, measuring and recording data, diagrammatic and map skills. They also understand the causes and challenges of differences in human access to resources across the

planet to consider possible solutions.

There are several trips to visit local places of historical interest and worship throughout the year. Arnold House boys have often been successful in the Townsend Warner History Prize.

Humanities are taught by form teachers in the junior part of the school, whereas from Year 5 until Year 8 boys are taught by subject specialists. Boys follow the Common Entrance syllabus in History, Religious Studies and Geography, although they are no longer required to sit the CE exams.

Summary of the Role

We are looking for an enthusiastic and inspiring teacher to lead the RS Department and to teach History and Geography to boys from Year 5 to 8 according to the Common Entrance syllabus. The boys are highly motivated and enthusiastic.

Arnold House offers excellent benefits including a competitive salary, access to our contributory pension scheme, free lunches during term time, access to the cycle to work scheme and a good proportion of non-contact time.

Generous benefits reflect the fact that teachers 'go the extra mile' in a school such as ours by contributing to sports,



drama productions, trips, clubs and other activities. All teachers take a share in supervisory duties and enjoy the benefit of a number of non-contact periods each week which they can use for lesson preparation, marking etc.
